USTA PRO CIRCUIT MEN'S TENNIS COMES TO NAPLES

The **Sanchez-Casal Men's Futures sponsored by Germain BMW Naples** is taking place in Naples for the first time. Naples also hosted a men's USTA Pro Circuit event from 1992-94. Naples first hosted USTA Pro Circuit women's tennis in 2002, when the city held a \$50,000 women's event. It also hosted a \$50,000 women's event in 2000 and the city hosts a \$25,000 USTA Pro Circuit women's event this May.

Notable players competing in Naples include:

Ryan Shane, 23, Falls Church, Va.

- Graduated from the University of Virginia in 2016 after a stellar collegiate career.
- During his junior season, won the NCAA singles title and finished as the No. 2-ranked collegiate player in the country.
- Was a member of three NCAA championship teams with Virginia, winning team titles in 2013, 2015 and 2016.
- Earned All-America honors during his junior and senior years, finishing his collegiate career with a 103-36 record in singles play.
- Holds four USTA Pro Circuit singles titles, including two titles in 2017, and two doubles titles.
- Competed in the main draw of the 2015 US Open as a wild card.
- Served as a practice partner for the U.S. Davis Cup team in its first-round tie against Switzerland this year in Birmingham, Ala.

Raleigh Smith, 26, Miami

- Graduated in 2014 from Northwestern.
- Was selected First Team All-Big Ten his junior and senior years.
- Graduated with 130 singles and doubles wins.
- Holds six ITF Pro Circuit doubles titles—two titles in Morocco and one in the U.S. in 2017, and three in 2015 in Turkey, Israel and the Dominican Republic.

Julian Zlobinsky, 21, Greenvale, N.Y.

- Currently a redshirt junior at Wake Forest.
- Spent first three seasons at the University of Texas.

Ryan Shane graduated from the University of Virginia in 2016 after a stellar collegiate career, winning the NCAA singles title his junior year. He was also a member of three NCAA championship teams with Virginia.

- Redshirted freshman year in 2014-15 and played for the Longhorns the last two seasons, where he went 31-19 overall.
- Turns 22 on January 8

Notable players competing in qualifying include:

Aron Hiltzik, 21, Wilmette, Ill.

- Currently a senior at Illinois. Played with brother Jared for two seasons at Illinois.
- Through his junior season, held a 21-2 singles record in Big Ten play.
- Earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors in 2015 and 2017.
- Has ranked as high as No. 20 in singles in the collegiate rankings and No. 23 in doubles, both in March 2017.

Vasil Kirkov, 18, Tampa, Fla.

- Competed in 2016 US Open qualifying as a wild card after reaching the final of the USTA Boys' 18s Championships in Kalamazoo, Mich., last summer.
- Also competed in the US Open, French

Open and Wimbledon juniors in 2016, advancing to the doubles quarterfinals at Wimbledon.

- Reached the French Open junior doubles final in 2017.
- Ranked as high as No. 13 in the ITF World Junior Rankings in February 2017.
- Has trained with Ivan Lendl as part of a USTA Player Development initiative.

Trent Bryde, 18, Atlanta

- Peaked at No. 8 in the ITF World Junior Rankings in April 2017.
- Reached the doubles semifinals at the 2017 junior US Open.
- Has competed in all four junior Grand Slam events.
