The USTA League iPhone application gets you in the game like never before. It allows you to track measure and improve your league and your team at your convenience—with everything you need right at your fingertips.

### League iPhone App FAQs.

1. Will this app be available for the Blackberry or Android?  
Right now the app is only for the iPhone, iPad, and iPod touch but, we will continue to evaluate the mobile needs for USTA League players.
2. Where can I download the new League app?  
The League app is available in the App Store on iTunes
3. If I input my match scores on the app will it show up in TennisLink?  
Yes, the app works in conjunction with the online version of TennisLink
4. If I'm a captain do I have to use the League app?  
No, you can go online to access TennisLink just as you have before.
5. As a player, can I register for a team using the League app?  
No, you will need to go online to TennisLink to register.
6. Where is my entire past historical USTA match data?  
The app only displays the last year, current year and upcoming year early start play. All historical data can still be found online.

### **PLEASE NOTE: Use of Cell Phones and Electronic Devices on Court**

Use of electronic devices on court is a violation of the code under all governing bodies of tennis.

What happens when a cell phone or electronic device goes the first time?

- In an unofficiated match a player may claim a let for a cell phone or pager of an opponent and then claim a point for each subsequent disturbance under the Hindrance Rule.
- Only a certified USTA official may issue a Code Violation with regard to this issue in particular when a player has been instructed to turn the device off and stow it.
