
COVID-19 Updates

- As of now, no USTA Programming until May 31
- National Adult League and JTT Championships cancelled
- National L1-L3 tournaments cancelled thru July 11
 - Includes Early Development Camps
- As of now, local and Sectional tourneys can resume June 1
 - Midwest Closed likely to be postponed
 - District Qualifiers likely to be cancelled; could be replaced with a Closed Level 3 Chicago Championship
- Tennis Industry United site to assist clubs/pros (link slide 32)
- USTA grants to facilities to assist with reopening

“The website, the structure, the service and often the professionals can be **overwhelmingly confusing** and seemingly unnecessarily complicated **creating a barrier** that prevents tennis from growing.”

“There's **too much pressure** on playing just one sport; it leads to repetitive use **injuries and burn out**. Our son was pretty happy to put down his racquets after his last match senior year.”

“**Cheating**...I hate it and it's always the kids who it hurts the most are the ones you don't want it to... **that's basically the reason my older kid ended up quitting.**”



“It just feels like **in tennis you are completely alone** not like in other sports. I really wish my son would switch to another sport.”

“Too competitive for young ages, **not fun**, and it's **just about points** and winning even for young kids.”

“In my career I've actually **turned down certain roles and taken certain jobs** through my career so I can travel with my children.”

“Tennis is taking away some of the fun and pushing for a more competitive experience to the **detriment of kids physically and mentally.**”




New Tournament General Classifications




New Ranking Calculations

- One nationwide Standings List and PPR table
- Best of 6 singles and best of 6 doubles count for standing
 - 15% of doubles results count for singles standing
- For BG 14,16,18: no more than 3 results from tournaments outside of Section count for ranking
- For BG 12: no more than 2 results from tournaments outside of section count for ranking
- 20% of a players' points move as a player ages up

Chicago District Tournament Activity




of Tournaments by Level




Chicago District Tournament Activity



| Round Robin Points per Round (max 4 rounds) | 30 | 8 |

| Selection Process from Standings List | Top Down | Bottom Up |

USTA JUNIOR TOURNAMENTS
(RANKING) BREAKDOWN BY LEVEL FOR PLAYERS IN
USTA/MIDWEST SECTION

SECTION LEVEL 4 (UP TO 4 DAYS):

In 2020, these were called Midwest Section Level 2s.

Each Section will sanction 4 Closed Level 4s and 4 Open Level 4s. You can play in any Section's Open Level 4 event.

Each Section will sanction one Closed Level 4 Team Event (Team Cup).

USTA JUNIOR TOURNAMENTS
(RANKING) BREAKDOWN BY LEVEL FOR PLAYERS IN
USTA/MIDWEST SECTION

SECTION LEVEL 5 (UP TO 3 DAYS):

In 2020, these were called Section Level 3s.

Each Section will get an allotment of Open Level 5 tournaments to sanction.

The Midwest will also have up to two Closed District events to sanction as needed.

USTA MIDWEST

CDTA 2020 Sanctioning Changes

- Allowing > 1 tourney per age division on same weekend
 - Staggered registration deadlines based on 2019 signups
- Loosening geographical restrictions

Transitioning Away From TennisLink

- New Tennis Management Tool (TMT) platform in 2021
- TennisLink to be used for all **2020** tournaments
- New application process on TMT for **2021** events (expected to launch in early Q3 of 2020)
- TennisLink will not accept Sanction forms for Tournaments with a start date of 1/1/2021 or later
- National, Sections, and Districts will not open up 2021 Sanctioning until the new system is ready
- Training coming for the TMT system
