Mark Doren

Men's and Women's Tennis Coach, Ferris State University (DII)

Ferris State University alum Mark Doren was appointed as the permanent head coach for the Bulldogs before the 2019-20 season. He'll begin his second campaign as the official head coach in 2020-21 at FSU. Doren, who served as the interim head coach for both squads in 2018-19, led the men's tennis team to the 2019 NCAA Division II Midwest Regional Championship match and the Bulldogs also finished as the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Tournament runner-up during a successful post-season run.

Along with his duties with the Bulldog tennis programs, Doren has also served as the administrative assistant for the school's nationally-renown PTM program at FSU where he's been responsible for recruitment and assisted in teaching program classes at the FSU Racquet and Fitness Center. He's also helped lead player development to improve student abilities. His efforts helped the PTM program double its recruitment last fall over the previous two years.

In addition to working at FSU, Doren has worked as a head tennis professional at the MVP Athletic Club in West Michigan since 2008. In that role, he organized and coached all travel teams and expanded club revenue with growth in all programs. During his time with the club, he also developed a successful elite junior program that has produced upwards of 15 collegiate student-athletes. His tenure helped the organization establish a large following within the community.

Doren earned his bachelor's degree in marketing and Professional Tennis Management from Ferris State.



Dr. Jim Love

Women's Tennis Coach, College of Lake County (JUCO)

Dr. James R. Love (Jim) coaches men's and women's tennis. Jim earned an Associate in Arts degree from College of DuPage in Glen Ellyn, where as a tennis player he qualified for the National Junior College Athletic Association national tournament. Jim earned a tennis scholarship to Northwestern University in Evanston, where he received his bachelor's degree. Jim has worked as a full-time tennis professional, high school teacher/tennis coach and school administrator. He coached the boys' and girls' tennis teams at Lyons Township High School in LaGrange, working with players and teams that were conference, sectional and state champions. Jim, a United States Professional Tennis Association (USPTA) and Professional Tennis Registry (PTR) certified tennis professional, currently teaches tennis at The Libertyville Club. Jim's goals as a CLC coach are to help students get the best junior college education, learn to enjoy tennis as a lifetime sport and achieve their highest potential as competitors.



Tyler Scanlan

Women's Tennis Coach, Marian University (NAIA)

Tyler Scanlan is entering his fourth season as head coach of the Marian women's tennis program. During his third season as head coach, the Knights went 11-4 overall. Marian finished as the Crossroads League regular season runner up with an 8-1 record and finished as the runner up in the league tournament. Marian was ranked No. 24 in the NAIA in the final rankings.

During his second season at the helm, the Knights went 16-10 after battling through injuries. Marian finished second in the Crossroads League with an 8-1 record. The Knights finished the fall portion of the schedule 10-3 overall and reached as high as No. 22 in the national polls.

Scanlan also served as an assistant coach at Southport and Franklin Central High School, and as operations manager for the National Junior Tennis League.

A Marian University alum, Scanlan graduated in 2014 with a Bachelor's of Science in Finance.

**Ruth McGuire**

Men's and Women's Tennis Coach, Milwaukee School of Engineering (DII)

Coach Ruth McGuire is in her 4th year as Head Coach of MSOE MTN and WTN. Prior to this she coached High School Boys and Girls Tennis from 2005-2017 at Dominican High School, MUHS and DSHA. She has been USPTA Certified since 2007. Outside of her tennis career, she serves as a volunteer on several charitable boards in the Milwaukee Community. She currently lives in Mequon with her husband, Steve, and her dog, Chance

**Mark Riley**

Men's Tennis Coach, Kalamazoo College (DIII)

Mark Riley was named Kalamazoo College's head men's tennis coach and assistant director of the USTA Boys' 18 & 16 National Championships on June 29, 2007. Mark assisted at the 2007 tournament and began directing it in 2008. He was named Wilson/ITA Central Region Coach of the Year in 2017 after leading the Hornets to an 18-2 record.

Riley's 2010 and 2019 Kalamazoo College teams advanced to NCAA III Regional Championship matches. In 2010, the Hornets' sent two players (Pat Boyd/Cyrus Jadun) to the NCAA III Doubles Championships where they earned All-American honors. Branden Metzler competed in the NCAA III Singles Championships in 2016 and 2017, earning All-American honors both years. He advanced to the finals in 2016 and

finished the season ranked No. 3 in the nation. He advanced to the semifinals in 2017 and finished the season ranked No. 4. Riley coached Ian Yi to a No. 17 national ranking at the end of 2019.

Riley, a 1982 graduate of Kalamazoo College, was head men's tennis coach at the University of Pennsylvania for seven seasons before returning to Kalamazoo. He led the Quakers to Ivy League championships in 2006 and 2007's Eastern College Athletic Conference championships in 2005 and 2006. At Pennsylvania, Riley coached eight First Team All-Ivy selections, two Ivy League Rookies of the Year and an Intercollegiate Tennis Association Northeast Rookie of the Year. In 2006, Riley was named Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year, United States Tennis Association-Middle States Tennis Association Section Coach of the Year, and Philadelphia Area Tennis District Collegiate Coach of the Year. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Riley was Tournament Director for the ITA East Region Championships in 2002 and 2006. He was inducted into the Penn Tennis Hall of Fame on Nov. 4, 2017.

He earned a bachelor's degree in economics from Kalamazoo College in 1982. Riley presently serves on the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Division III Central Region Awards Committee-Chair (2018-present), the NCAA Division III Tennis Committee (2019-present), and the NCAA Division III Rules Subcommittee (2020-present).

**Timon Corwin (Moderator)**

General Manager/COO, Western Racquet Club; Chair, Collegiate Committee, USTA/Midwest Section

Timon Corwin, joined Western Racquet Club in June 2010. Previously, he served as the Senior Director for Junior and Collegiate Competition for USTA Player Development in Boca Raton, Florida. He was also the Men's Athletics Director and Men's Tennis Coach at Kalamazoo, Michigan.

Corwin was named Intercollegiate Tennis Association's NCAA Division III National Coach of the Year in 1997 and Midwest Regional Coach of the Year in 1999. From 1993-2007, Corwin was also the USTA National Tournament Director for the USTA Boys' 16 & 18 National Championships. In 2014, Corwin was enshrined into the ITA Men's Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame.

Corwin played professionally after a successful collegiate career at Kalamazoo College. As an eight-time All-American in singles and doubles with the Kalamazoo men's tennis team from 1983-86, Corwin led his squad to the 1986 NCAA Division III team championship title while winning the singles crown. That year, Corwin was the recipient of the ITA's National Arthur Ashe Award for Leadership and Sportsmanship. Corwin went on to complete a post-graduate fellowship at Rheinische Friedrich-Wilhelms University in Bonn, Germany in 1987 and earned his law degree from the Marquette University Law School in 1992.

Corwin currently serves as the chair of the USTA Midwest Collegiate Committee.
