What Is Quota?

Annually, the USTA National Junior Tournament Schedule has four (4) Level 1 Championships that use Section Quota as a factor within the player acceptance process. Each Sectional Association is guaranteed a minimum number of junior players who will be accepted into the USTA National Level 1 Championships, and this number is the Sectional Association's quota. Only players residing in the Midwest Section will appear on our quota list. These lists are calculated similarly to the National Standings Lists in that they will be based on results from the past 12 months.

How is Quota calculated?

In all Boys' and Girls' 12-18 Divisions, no more than two results outside of the Midwest section may count towards a player's top six singles and doubles results - four in section (sanctioned by Midwest or a Midwest district), two out of section.

How do the different tournament levels count?

- National Level 1 Tournaments: Out of Section
- National Level 2 Tournaments: Out of Section
 - Exception: The Intersectional Level 2 Tournament, Battle of the Mississippi, counts as in section
- National Open Level 3 Tournaments: Out of Section
- Midwest Closed Level 3 Tournaments: In Section
- Midwest Open Level 4 & 5 Tournaments: In Section
 - Open Level 4 & 5 tournaments not held in the Midwest will count for out of section
- Midwest Closed Level 4 & 5 Tournaments: In Section
- Midwest Level 6 & 7 Tournaments: In Section
