



USTA BOYS' AND GIRLS' 14 INTERSECTIONAL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS
JULY 6-10, 2019
BG14: Auburn, Alabama

PLEASE READ: As of January 1, 2019 USTA NorCal is **no longer** providing team managers/chaperones for team events. The section will continue to select teams and hire coaches to represent USTA NorCal, however, parents/legal guardians are required to facilitate all logistical arrangements for their child to participate. Players representing USTA NorCal shall exhibit the highest ideals of good sportsmanship both on and off the court. Players shall adhere to the rules and policies set by the Team Coach. The Team Coach shall also have the discretion to remove a player from the team during the competition for one or more remaining matches if the player exhibits poor sportsmanship or violates the rules and policies.

NorCal fields one team of 4 boys and one team of 4 girls for each tournament - they compete together as one team. The USTA permits a Section to send a team of 3 to 4 boys and 3 to 4 girls, with the 4th boy and girl player designated as the alternate. The alternate plays each day and the USTA has a specific policy for how this takes place. Please read below under "Policy for 4th Team Member" for more information.

ELIGIBILITY: Players must meet the USTA national age eligibility and citizenship requirements to be selected. Players must also meet the USTA NorCal Residency requirements as described in Rule 3 of the USTA NorCal Junior Tournament Rules.

ENTRY & PAYMENT: To be considered for this event, each player must complete the following steps:

Team selection will be announced to all applicants by the end of **Friday, May 31ST** via email. Alternates do not travel to the event.

RANKING POINTS: Players will receive sectional and national ranking points for each win in singles and doubles but not mixed doubles.

For USTA NorCal, each player will receive 150 sectional ranking points for each win in singles and doubles, regardless of the position of the player on the team.

For USTA, national ranking points will vary since ranking points earned are based on the playing position of each player on the line-up. Any Bonus Points earned will be added to the total for national rankings.

PLAYER SELECTION: Four boys and girls for each team will be selected from the applicants as follows:

- The winner of the USTA NorCal May Excellence Singles Tournament up to 1 player
- If not previously selected the player ranked #1 on the most recently published NorCal Combined Final Ranking List of the division..... up to 1 player
- Up to 1 Wildcard player may be selected up to 1 player
- If not previously selected the player with the highest standing on the most recently published National Standing List of the division..... up to 1 player
- Players not previously selected that are in the top 100 of the most recently published National Standing List of the division AND who have played to completion at least one USTA NorCal Championship, Super Series or Excellence Tournament in any division within the immediately preceding 6 months, selected by order of standing.*
- Vacancies will be filled with players from the most recently published NorCal Combined Final Ranking List of the division, selected by order of rank.

Notwithstanding the selection process described above, players with a history of poor sportsmanship, including a history of withdrawals, may be excluded from selection.

* *Playing the tournament to completion means a player must not have withdrawn from the tournament without playing a match. Matches won by withdrawal, walkover, default and retirement count as playing a match.*

POLICY FOR 4TH TEAM MEMBER: Every team member must play in at least one official Team Match per day and at least one official team singles match during the entire competition. For example, the #4 player can play doubles every day, except one day on which that player must play singles.

TEAM LINE-UP: Line-ups will be ordered as follows:

- Players in the top 100 of the most recently published National Standings List of the division will be ordered first, in the order of their standing.
- Remaining players are ordered by rank using the most recently published NorCal Combined Final Ranking Lists.
- Wildcard recipients will be placed in the lineup as determined by the Selection Committee.
- Notwithstanding the line-up procedure above, the Selection Committee may order a player higher or lower if justified by the ratings of all selected players.

Line-ups will be announced to the participants as soon as possible after selection and line-up order is determined.

WILDCARDS:

- To be considered, a player must submit a timely entry to USTA NorCal no later than the entry deadline - note that this is not the tournament entry deadline by which Sections must submit their teams to the tournament, but the published deadline set by NorCal for being eligible for consideration for selection.
- Players may submit a request to be considered for a Wildcard, but this request is not required.
- The Selection Committee shall be comprised of the Manager of Player Development, Player Development Specialist, Junior Competition Coordinator, and Chair of Junior Council.
- Wildcards do not have to be awarded.
- There is no specific selection criteria for the Wildcards, however the purpose of awarding Wildcards (if any) shall be for NorCal to field the strongest teams possible. Notwithstanding the purpose to field a strong team, players with a history of poor sportsmanship, including a history of withdrawals, may be excluded from consideration.

Wildcard applications are due by **Monday, May 27th**.

FORMAT & SCHEDULE OF PLAY: A team match consists of three (3) boys' singles, three (3) girls' singles, one (1) boys' doubles, one (1) girls' doubles, and one (1) mixed doubles. Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles matches will all be best of 3 Tiebreak Sets. Singles matches will count as one point each. Doubles matches will count as one point each. Mixed doubles matches will count as one point for the team score but not for ranking. Each team match consists of 9 points (6 singles, 2 doubles and 1 mixed doubles).

A Round Robin team competition will be used for the first three days of play. The last two days will be used for the Championship Bracket playoffs and Consolation playoffs with a Compass Draw format.

Match-play begins on **Saturday, July 6th** and ends **Wednesday, July 10th**. If selected, players should plan to arrive by **Thursday, July 4th** and must commit to the entire schedule.

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS:

Withdrawals After Entry Deadline:

Immediately contact Beth Workeneh (510-263-0466/ workeneh@norcal.usta.com) if you need to withdraw from the tournament after entries close:

- If the withdrawal is due to an injury or illness, the USTA Regulations require the injured or ill player to submit written verification from a medical professional before the end of the day on July 10th (the last day of the tournament).
- If the withdrawal is due to a personal circumstance, the player must submit a written description of the situation no later than the end of the day on July 10th (the last day of the tournament) so that it can be determined whether or not the situation qualifies as a personal circumstance.

Please also include the date it was determined the player needed to withdraw and if there was a delay in notifying NorCal, please provide an explanation for the delay. Written verification can be emailed or faxed to Beth Workeneh (workeneh@norcal.usta.com/fax: 510-748-7377).

Entry Fee Refunds When Withdrawal Occurs After Entry Deadline:

Although the USTA Regulations do not require an entry fee refund for a national tournament after the entry deadline, NorCal has elected at its discretion to refund a player's entry fee:

- If the player immediately withdraws when circumstances arise that do not permit participation and
- The player's withdrawal is due to illness, injury, or personal circumstance as evidenced by the receipt of written verification as described above.

TEAM COACH: The USTA Northern California Section will select and send one (1) Team Coach to the event. The Team Coach may coach players at specific times during matches. Players' personal coaches and parents are **NOT** permitted to coach during this event.

TEAM WORKOUT: All players selected are expected to attend a mandatory team practice with the team coaches on **Sunday, June 30th**. The approximately 3-hour team workout event will include no less than 2 hours of tennis and a meeting prior to or following tennis. Attendance by the players is mandatory, unless clearance is given by USTA NorCal.

This team workout will be held by the team coaches and USTA NorCal staff for the participants in the USTA Boys' and Girls' 16 & 14 Intersectional Team Championships. There is no charge for the team workout.

The purpose of this workout is to:

- Build team spirit and camaraderie
- Introduce the coaches to the players and parents
- Allow for time to review policies and rules prior to arriving at the tournament, with the opportunity to ask questions
