



# Section Championship Procedures

## *Adult 40 & Over*

### ELIGIBILITY, RULES, REGULATIONS

- **Required Matches for Sectionals:** minimum of two matches (one can be a default)
- **Required Matches for Nationals:** minimum of three matches (one can be a default) for computer-rated players; minimum of four matches (none can be a default) for self-rated players
  - 2.5 Division: there is no National Championship at the 2.5 Men's and Women's divisions
- All players must have a **current USTA Membership through the end of event** to compete
- [National and PNW USTA League Regulations](#) will be enforced during Sectionals
- **Match-Line Ups** should be submitted by the team captain at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the scheduled match time. Penalties may be enforced at the Tournament Director or Referee's discretion. Lateness penalties will follow per Friend at Court, unless the Tournament Director or Referee deems an exception for extenuating circumstances.
- **Players on Multiple Teams:**
  - Players who qualify on more than one team **at a different NTRP Level** may compete in both. Captains must complete the [Scheduling Request for Player on Multiple Teams](#) form BEFORE the team registration deadline.
  - Players who qualify on more than one team at the **same Division AND NTRP Level** must declare which team they will play for through Sectionals. The player may join any of the other teams at the conclusion of Sectionals to compete in the National Championships (if eligible).

### SCORING

- **Format:** best of three tiebreak sets with a set tiebreak at 6-all. Match tiebreak (first to 10 points, win by 2) in lieu of a third set.
  - Play out the ads
  - Change sides after all odd total games
  - Continuous play after the first game of each set; 90 seconds on change overs; 2 minute set break
- **Tiebreak Procedure:** if event is entirely indoors, switch every 6 points for all tiebreaks (set or match). If event is both indoors and outdoors, Coman Tie Break procedure for all tiebreaks (set or match; inside and out).
- **Scoring Modification:** the Tournament Director reserves the right to modify the scoring if needed due to weather or other delays beyond our control.

### CHAMPIONSHIP FLIGHT SET-UP

- Round Robin, non-elimination format. Two sub-flights per division. The winner of each flight will play each other in the Finals. The goal is to have 8 teams in each division with 2 flights (4 teams in each flight) to provide teams 3 round robin matches. This however, is not guaranteed, and could be more or less teams/matches.  
*Note: if there are five teams or less in a division, there will be one flight with no finals.*

- For the 3.0-4.5+ Divisions, matches are set up as points per position. #1 doubles is 2 points, while #1 singles, #2 doubles, and #3 doubles are 1 point. The winner of each flight will be determined by total points won. In the event of a tie in the standings, the following procedure will be used to break the tie (in order):
  1. Winner of head-to-head match
  2. Winner of the fewest number of sets lost
  3. Winner of the fewest number of games lost
  4. Should further tiebreakers be needed, refer to PNW Regulation 2.01C(3)b
- For the 2.5 Division, the winner of each flight will be determined by team matches won. In the event of a tie in the standings, the following procedure will be used to break the tie (in order):
  1. Winner of the most individual matches
  2. Winner of head-to-head match
  3. Winner of the fewest number of sets lost
  4. Winner of the fewest number of games lost
  5. Procedure to be determined by Championship Committee

## NTRP DYNAMIC DISQUALIFICATION

- USTA PNW will follow National Regulation 2.04B(2)a which states the following: *Run dynamic calculations and produce ratings throughout the championship. Through the conclusion of the championship event, notify and disqualify any player who meets the criteria for NTRP Dynamic Disqualification and reverse appropriate matches played.*
  - This applies only to Adult 18, Adult 40, and Adult 55 & Over Championships (not Mixed Leagues)

## COACHING AND OFFICIALS

- **Coaching:** no coaching is allowed. Cell phone and other electronic devices are not to be used on court without permission from the Tournament Director or Referee. Smartwatches must be put in airplane mode.
- **Tournament Referee:** USTA PNW intends on having a Certified USTA Official as the Referee
- **Roving Officials:** there will be at least one USTA certified official at each location. This USTA certified official will periodically rove and be available to assist with any on court issues or questions.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER AND SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENTS

- **Format Change:** please note that the tournament format, number of matches, scoring, and match length may change due to a team not showing up or circumstances beyond our control such as weather. Rain, extreme heat, or other condition could cause delays, modifications to the format and scoring, or other changes which deviate from the announced scheduled. In the event of a lengthy delay due to this, it will be at the discretion of the Tournament Director to use an alternative-playing format.
- **Schedule Changes/Updates:** in the event of suspension of play caused by inclement weather or other issue, please keep your cell phones handy as updates will be texted to you as soon as possible using our texting service. They will also be posted to the event webpage. *Captains - please list all your players' cell phone numbers and email addresses upon online registration so we can keep them updated as well!* Unless you hear otherwise, all players should plan on reporting to their scheduled match 30 minutes ahead of time.

## MOVE UP/SPLIT UP

- If you are a Section Champion, your team qualifies for a National Championship (except for 2.5 Men and Women). This means your team must either move up or split up the following league year. This regulation only applies to the same Division, same age group, and same NTRP Team level that the team qualified for or advanced to a National Championships, and applies only to players that were eligible to advance.
