Blueprint II for Success Chapters Elevate

The second cohort of five blueprint chapters have one goal and that is to continue to improve their organizations to benefit kids in their communities for the unforeseeable future and expose them to advantageous opportunities. With technical and financial assistance provided by USTA Southern, the Southern Tennis Foundation and the USTA Foundation, they are stronger and more viable than ever. Board development training with guidance to form working boards, advice on strategically hiring staff, encouraging relationships with potential funders are just a few areas where they continue to shine. The evidence is clear when the results unfold, and a chapter such as Excite All Stars triples its fundraising efforts in two years.

Here are a few highlights:

Excite All Stars NJTL – Camp Catahoula 2023 - An overnight camp held July 10-12 at Bayou Segnette State Park that included activities such a luau, building a bonfire and making smores, a dance party, arts & crafts, various indoor and outdoor games, STEM activities, and more.



DD&J Foundation NJTL – Hosted several summer camps including a 6-week “Lob the Ball to Financial Literacy” camp, June 20 – July 27th in coordination with the city of Columbia.



Chattanooga NJTL – To host an inaugural sponsorship fundraiser event called “Taste of the Tour” in October at Manker Patten Tennis Club.



Raleigh Tennis NJTL – Created a strategic plan to support the NJTL as they searched for and hired a new Executive Director. Tools such as Hello Insight will be implemented to measure success.



Public Tennis Inc. NJTL – Took advantage of a KidsREAD book donation program by hosting a “Tennis for Learning” event at Hardeeville Elementary School for 3rd & 4th Graders.



In Loving Memory of William “Coach Wink” Fulton & Daron Sellars

William “Coach Wink” Fulton Jr. was one of the most beloved coaches in the Atlanta Community and beyond. He worked 30 years at the McGhee and Washington Park Tennis Centers. Coach Wink’s NJTL impacted hundreds of youth through programming, US Open trips to NY and the Arthur Ashe Essay Contests. His legacy will live on through the lives he impacted.

Daron Sellars, Founder/CEO of the National Black Professional Athletes Foundation was an entrepreneur, community developer and USTA Southern NJTL Supporter. An award winning businessman, Sellars inspired our youth with his leadership, philanthropy and commitment to social justice.

A's & Aces Selects Two Scholar-Athletes as the Inaugural

Dr. James B. Ewers, Jr. 'Junior Fellows'

Two scholar-athletes have been selected for the Dr. James B. Ewers Jr. Junior Fellowship Program. This Program is an A's & Aces Career Development Initiative developed to prepare exceptional participants of early high school status (ages 14-16) for the leadership and responsibility of being a tennis coach/mentor while training to improve their own tennis game. These Junior Fellows were selected based on several criteria, including leadership potential, academic performance, tennis interest, exceptional character, sportsmanship, and teamwork skills.

The inaugural Junior Fellows include Matison Williams and Zachary Maple. Matison is an incoming first-year student at Ben Franklin High School. Matison is an accomplished Louisiana tennis player who plans to play tennis in high school and college. She is ranked top 30 in the State in her age division. Matison had a 4.0 GPA throughout elementary and middle school, graduating as a salutarian. Zachary is a rising junior attending John Curtis High School. He is on the academic A/B honor roll with high college aspirations. He is a versatile athlete, engaged in tennis and track at his high school. One of his goals is to teach other children how to play tennis and enjoy the game for life.

Fellowship Background: The Dr. Ewers Junior Fellowship Program is designed to provide youth with an opportunity to develop leadership and management skills, discover and build life skills, and improve their athletic and coaching capabilities. The Program is named after Dr. James B. Ewers Jr., a youth advocate, educator, coach, author, and social justice activist, who was inducted into the Black Tennis Hall of Fame in 2021. Dr. James B. Ewers, Jr. is a native of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and a product of the parochial and public schools there. He is an educator with over forty years of experience in working at the college and secondary school level. During this time, he has developed programs and activities for traditional and non-traditional students. He has also created partnerships with businesses that have resulted in the creation of jobs for many students.
