



RAIN SCHEDULE: In the event that rain (or other inclement weather) severely delays the Sectional, the Tournament Committee may shorten the format.

REGULATIONS

1. The USTA Texas Section Championship Events will be played on hard courts.
2. PENN will be the official ball.
3. Round Robin Format will be used. Scoring will be the best two out of three sets using regular scoring for the first two sets. If the match should go to a third set, a “match” tie break will be played in lieu of a third set (first to 10 winning by 2).

In the event of a tie, after completing play in their respective groups or in any round robin play, the tie shall be broken by the first of the following procedures that does so:

- 2.03H(1) Individual Matches. Winner of the most individual matches in the entire competition.
 - 2.03H(2) Head-to-Head. Winner of head-to-head match.
 - 2.03H(3) Sets. Loser of the fewest number of sets.
 - 2.03H(4) Games. Loser of the fewest number of games.
 - 2.03H(5) TOSS OF COIN. The coin shall be tossed by a league official.
4. A 5 minute warm-up period, including practice serves, and a 15 minute default period shall be observed throughout the event.
 5. At the conclusion of each team match, both Captains must return to the Tournament Desk to sign the team scorecard. Each winning player is asked to report his/her match score to the Tournament Desk at the conclusion of each individual match and to return balls.
 6. All USTA Rules of Play, the USTA Code of Conduct, and the Point Penalty System will be enforced.
 7. Players are expected to wear attire appropriate for this event.
 8. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to alter the format, the scoring method, or terminate the team match when one team has won the majority of the points. However, without directive from the Tournament Committee, the teams are expected to play all matches to completion
 9. In a 4 flight Round Robin, the semi-final matches will be:

Flight 1	Flight 3
Vs	Vs
Flight 2	Flight 4

COURT CONDUCT

****All players will abide by the USTA Rules and “The Code.”** When playing without an umpire, the server will call the score after each point, clearly and loudly enough for his/her opponents to hear. Line calls will be made as accurately as possible. Remember that if you cannot tell your opponent’s shot is out, it is presumed good. Do not ask opinions from spectators. No coaching of any player will be permitted at any time. Please follow all rules promptly. Be ready to receive serve promptly. Always ensure that your opponent is ready for your serve.
