Accessibility and affordability to compete at a high level in our sport can create enduring experiences in the sport for our junior players. To decrease the cost of junior players attending a National Team event to represent USTA Northern, registration fees were cut by 25 percent.

Team USA Camps

USTA Northern hosted two Team USA Camps in 2019. The camps were held April 6th & 7th and September 28th & 29th at the Rochester Athletic Club. Twenty-four kids from across the section were selected to attend the camps. The camps focused on birth years: '06, '07, and '08. For the second camp of the year, we were able to invite two '09 kids from our Early Development Camp program.

Early Development Camps (EDC's)

USTA Northern hosted eight EDC's. The camps were held with players from birth years '09, '10 and '11. A record-breaking number of players attended USTA Northern EDC's this year - 69 players were selected by the Player ID & Development Committee. Two camps were held at Life Time - Lakeville (April/October), two camps were held at the Rochester Athletic Club (May/September) and four camps were held in Sioux Falls, SD (May/October).

Competition Training Centers (CTC's)

USTA Northern conducted three (3) CTC's in the following locations: Aberdeen, SD, Valley City, ND and Brainerd, MN. The CTC's reach out to those players and coaches on a more localized level.

Junior Team Tennis Leagues

Section play became more accessible for USTA Northern's non-Twin Cities teams. Multiple teams returned to JTT section play as a result, including Rapid City, Duluth and Fargo. USTA Northern offered 2 different leagues, Advancing and Non-Advancing.

Advancing follows the National JTT regulations.

Non-advancing track mirrors the advancing track without the requirements of USTA membership or National eligibility rules and mimics high school play.

Twin Cities Participation

Twin Cities Local League Player participation is up 1.13% from 2018 to 2019.

- 92.8% of league play takes place in the Twin Cities Metro Area.
- In appreciation for their commitment to USTA Northern's Adult League program, approximately 450 captains and co-captains were shipped an embroidered hooded, full-zip sweatshirt.
- In the Twin Cities, USTA League teams play matches 6 evenings per week, year-round at 16 indoor partner facilities. In the summer, we partner with an additional 6 country clubs and 35 public park and school facilities to rent courts for USTA League matches. Below is a summary of court rental fees paid to those partner facilities.

Highlights from 2019 USTA League National Championships:

- USTA Northern sent 43 teams to USTA League National Championships in 2019.
- Our highlights were three 1st place finishes by the Men's 55 & Over 6.0 and 7.0 and 65 & Over 6.0 teams, all captained by Eric Narvaez. Three additional USTA Northern teams advanced to Sunday play.

Tennis In Your Park

Tennis In Your Park is USTA Northern's Adult Recreational Lesson program in the Twin Cities metro area. We partner with local communities to offer Beginner, Advanced Beginner and Intermediate adult tennis lessons. In addition to lessons in 2019, this program expanded pathway options to include Drill and Play formats and Social Play (a weekly casual match play league, a season-ending player event, and a season-ending instructor event). Instructors are trained by USTA Northern staff with the Red, Orange, Green and Yellow Balls using the USTA National Intro to Tennis curriculum and the Net Generation curriculum.

 Participation in the program saw a 15% increase from 2018 for a total of 508 registrations in 2019. The program was held across 30 sites in 15 communities, with 21 instructors and 508 players.

2019 Social Play

- USTA Northern partnered with Lake Monster, Urban Growler, Sociable Cider Werks and Badger Hill Brewing to offer pop-up, red ball parking lot tennis. Approximately 130 players joined in the fun.
- Several partners continue to offer half-day Team Up events as well as drop in play options for adult players.

Adult Tournaments

In 2019, 1,962 players combined for 2,599 registrations at adult tournaments in our section.



lmpact

A huge component in fulfilling USTA Northern's mission of promoting and developing the growth of tennis is the impact it can create in the tennis community and the platform it can build to grow that family.

In 2019, USTA Northern disbursed more than \$73,000 through a variety of grants and event sponsorships to support grassroots, local tennis and get more people playing in our section.

Community Tennis Grant





Community Tennis Grants are for starting or expanding community-based tennis programs and activities. Four grant types were available in 2019: Project/Program Support, Organizational Capacity Building, Court Amenities, and Equipment. Funding amounts ranged from \$250 — \$5,000, depending on the size of the organization

and scope of the project.

Recipients of 2019 Community Tennis Grants

included Stonewall, which ran a multi-month social season out of InnerCity Tennis in the fall which featured red ball, cardio tennis and drills. Additionally, the Senior Tennis Players Club received a grant for their summer grandparent-grandchild clinics, allowing different generations to experience the game together.



USTA Northern Out and About

USTA Northern held its first Kids Day at a National Level 3 tournament being played at Baseline Tennis Center in October. Kids could register with a parent, watch high level junior tennis, then hop on court for games and activities before lunch. The concept has since been replicated twice in the early part of 2020 at college matches in Moorhead and Fau Claire.





Along with grants and running its own programs, USTA Northern is a consistent sponsor of tennis and non-tennis related events - though the pop up nets go with us to everything! Some sponsorship and event highlights of 2019 include Girls on the Run, Pride, the Medtronic Twin Cities Marathon which included a matching grant from USTA Northern for runners to fundraise for the tennis charity of their choice, the Pine Tree Apple Tennis Classic and a whole lot more!



Awards and Hall of Fame

Join us Thursday, August 6 at the Metropolitan Ballroom in Golden Valley, MN to celebrate the 2020 Hall of Fame inductees and section award winners.

Edwin (Skip) Gage - Long Lake, MN

Edwin "Skip" Gage started his journey in tennis on the public tennis courts of Evanston, IL, as an accomplished junior player. He would go on to be a standout varsity player at Northwestern University before moving to Minnesota in the late 1960's. There, he continued his devotion to the sport by continuing to play and joining the board of the Northwestern Tennis Patrons, now the InnerCity Tennis Foundation.

Skip was a board member for more than 40 years. During his tenure, he served as board chair and Chair Emeritus of ICT, USTA Northern's largest NJTL chapter. He worked for more than four decades as a volunteer to grow tennis in the Twin Cities and spent countless more hours fulfilling the mission of ICT through developing and unleashing youth potential on and off the tennis court.

Under Skip's leadership, the organization grew from a small group of philanthropists funding a handful of staff and volunteers operating summer youth tennis programming in a few city parks into a full-fledged, year-round social enterprise.

ICT now has a 21-member board, eight standing committees, 20 full-time staff, 11 part-time staff, 60 summer coaches, and more than 250 regular volunteers, serving more than 5,400 area youth. Primarily focused on youth development, ICT also owns and operates the Reed Sweatt Family Tennis Center in South Minneapolis, which serves thousands of tennis playing patrons from the greater Twin Cities area.

This place in the Hall of Fame will be awarded posthumously. Edwin "Skip" Gage died on Feb. 26, 2020, at the age of 79.

Bruce Gullikson - Burnsville, MN

Bruce has dedicated his life to playing, teaching and growing tennis. He currently serves as the Assistant Tennis Department Head Pro at Life Time Bloomington South and has worked there for 16 years. Bruce has taught full-time since 1989.

He also currently serves as the President for the USPTA Northern Division, having previously served as Regional Vice President. In other posts, he has been a Northern Zonal Coach for 20 years, area training center coach (working with the best players in their age division to supplement coaching that they may already be receiving), High Performance Certified Coach and Etcheberry Certified Coach. To further promote the sport, he has produced five different instructional DVDs. On the lighter, entertaining side, Bruce is a columnist in Northern Exposure, USTA Northern's print publication. He continues to speak at national conferences about the various aspects of running a successful tennis program. All told, more than 40 years of playing, coaching and advocacy for our sport, all with a bounce in his step and a commitment to creating enjoyable and meaningful experiences for the players spending their time with him on court.

Bruce is a longtime supporter of — and participant in — the Pine Tree Apple Tennis Classic that benefits children's cancer research and has raised thousands of dollars in support of that cause.
