



Executive Director

Message



USTA Northern experienced another stellar year in 2012, guided by its core values of Accountability, Commitment and Teamwork, Inclusiveness, Integrity and Service, while its strategic priorities remained Community Tennis, People/Resources/Structure, Fiscal Responsibility, Diversity and Inclusion and Player Development. Membership remained steady as the Section finished the year with almost 13,400 individual members, including 838 new 10-and-Under members, and 242 organizational members.

USTA Northern's programs were strong once again as Adult Tournament participation increased 15% to over 4,000 players in 2012. Adult USTA League participation also saw a 2% overall increase and an 8.9% jump outside the Twin Cities area. There was also a huge bump in mixed doubles USTA League participation and the Section is already seeing positive results from its 2013 League Restructure which was implemented in October. In 2013, USTA Northern is expanding from two to three 10-week seasons and still offering two 6-weeks intermediary sessions. The 2013 Early-Start League had 186 teams and 2,356 players and the Winter League recorded similar numbers (the entire 2012 Fall/Winter League had 204 teams and 2,717 players).

Surprisingly, there was a decrease in junior participation for 2012, as tournament play was down almost 5% and Jr. Team Tennis remained steady at about 2,700 registrations. JTT play was up 26 percent in South Dakota and 70 new players participated in the Twin Cities, but examining the reduction of junior participation will be a major goal in 2013.

The USTA and USTA Northern provided over \$120,000 of support to organizations and individuals in the Section, including \$17,475 in Community Tennis Grants and over \$65,000 in Public Facility Assistance funding. We also had 12 facilities add 10 and Under Tennis blended lines to their courts in 2012. Over \$10,000 was awarded to individuals through the Northern Tennis Foundation and USTA Northern boasted five national USTA Serves scholarship winners.

The Section was also recognized nationally both on and off the court as the **Fred Wells Tennis & Education Center** (St. Paul, Minn.) was named the 2012 USTA National Member Organization of the Year Award; the 2012 PTR National Public Facility of the Year; the 2012 USTA Level 4 and 5 NJTL of the Year and the Team Spirit Award winner at 2012 JTT 18-and-Under Advanced National Championships. **Sue Gregor** (Wayzata, Minn.) won the 2012 USTA



National Barbara Williams Leadership Award. The **Huether Family** (Sioux Falls, S.D.) was the 2012 USTA National Ralph Westcott Family of the Year. **Sierra Halverson** (Burtrum, Minn.) was named one of four USTA National Bill Talbert Junior Sportsmanship Award winners.

On the court, **Devon Bourget** (Eau Claire, Wis.) was the JTT Girls 14-and-Under Intermediate National Sportsmanship Winner; the 3.5 Senior Twin Cities Men, captained by **Boy Toy**, and the 9.0 Senior Mixed team, captained by **Nuri Hassumani** and **Pam Sommer**, won USTA League National Championships. **David Nash** (Bloomington, Minn.) won the Men's 65s National Grass Court Singles Championship and was the Men's 65 Super Senior International Championships Doubles Finalist; **Mickey Maule**

(Wayzata, Minn.) won the World and National 40s Men's Doubles Champion. **David Wheaton** (Tonka Bay, Minn.) was inducted into the ITA College Hall of Fame. **Jon Rydberg** (St. Paul, Minn.) was named to the United States Paralympics Tennis Team and won the 2012 PTR Wheelchair Professional of the Year; **Dan James** (Oakdale, Minn.) coached the United States Paralympic Tennis Team and was named the USOC Paralympic Coach of the Year and ITF Wheelchair Coach of the Year, and **Tim Kurtt** (St. Paul, Minn.) officiated all four Grand Slams and the Olympics in 2012.

In addition to the new USTA League structure in 2013 and focusing on junior participation and competition at all ages and levels, the Section has also reorganized by merging the North Dakota and South Dakota Tennis Service Representative positions and adding a Minnesota & Northwestern Wisconsin Tennis Service Representative. USTA Northern will also have its first-ever Director of Schools and Youth Recreation who will focus on 10 and Under Tennis around the Section. These changes were made so the Section can service and deliver tennis in a more effective manner across the Section.



We need to find more ways to support our existing partnerships, while actively seeking out new connections in continuing to grow the game.



Founded on January 9, 1961, as the Northwestern Tennis Association, USTA Northern serves Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota and the Northwestern section of Wisconsin.

A Board of Directors governs USTA Northern and the day-to-day operations of the organization are managed by a staff who reports to the Executive Director, who in turn, reports to the President of the Board of Directors.

The USTA Northern administrative staff, with help from hundreds of volunteers, is responsible for rankings, adult and junior tournament sanctions and schedules, rules and regulations, sportsmanship standards, junior development opportunities, community tennis support, adult and junior tennis leagues and overall tennis growth within the Section.

5. Serve as a model organization for all others who aspire to an inclusive environment.


Player Development







Fred Wells Tennis & Education Center

2012 USTA ORGANIZATION MEMBER OF THE YEAR



The **Fred Wells Tennis & Education Center** (FWTEC) in St. Paul, Minn., won the USTA Organization Member of the Year Award given annually to an organization that provides outstanding service to its members

and the local community. **Margot Willett**, the center's executive director, and **Lee Wells Booth**, daughter of founder **Fred Wells**, received the award.

The Fred Wells Tennis & Education Center is a public indoor and outdoor tennis facility which serves more than 2,500 people per year. The facility has eight 78-foot courts, three of which have blended lines used for 10 and Under Tennis, and one 60-foot 10 and Under Tennis court. Since opening its doors in 2002, FWTEC has remained focused on its mission of empowering youth to be successful on and off the court, through tennis and education opportunities that guide and challenge them mentally, physically, socially and academically. With tennis and education as its core programs, FWTEC manages to engage young people outside of the school day by making the programs accessible without regard to cost or transportation.

The FWTEC is open more than 300 days a year. "The Fort," as it is known to its patrons, supports an array of programming with more than 20 USTA League teams, as well as USTA Jr. Team Tennis and 10 and Under Tennis programs, Tennis Block Parties, Special Olympics competitions and special events throughout the year. The Center was also recognized by the USTA as a National Junior Tennis & Learning (NJTL) Chapter of the Year for 2012 and was the 2012 PTR Public Facility of the Year.

BARBARA WILLIAMS LEADERSHIP AWARD

Sue Gregor of Wayzata, Minn., won the Barbara Williams Leadership Award for her outstanding contributions in helping

grow tennis at the local level.

Established in 2003, the award honors the late **Barbara Williams**, a long time USTA volunteer who gave unselfishly of her time and energy to promote the sport of tennis. It recognizes a female volunteer who, through her leadership and by her example, has encouraged and inspired others to become volunteers and assume leadership roles at the community, section and/or national levels of the USTA.

Gregor started volunteering when her children were competing in junior tennis and has since been instrumental in promoting grassroots tennis. While serving on the National Jr. Team Tennis Committee, she instituted a number of changes that led to the skyrocketing growth and popularity of the Jr. Team Tennis program. In addition, Gregor serves as the vice chair of the USTA National Membership Committee and as chair of the USTA Northern Awards Committee, and she is a member of various USTA Northern committees. In 2009, she was inducted into the USTA Northern Hall of Fame.



Gregor was the driving force behind the development of a National Comprehensive Safety program to help educate providers and protect children in USTA programs. Through the initiative, the USTA is exploring and adopting the use of background checks for all coaches, volunteers and administrators of programs, as well as adopting other measures to ensure the safety of all children who participate in USTA programming.

RALPH W. WESTCOTT USTA FAMILY OF THE YEAR



The **Huether Family** of Sioux Falls, S.D., received the Ralph W. Westcott USTA Family of the Year Award. The Huether Family was recognized for its outstanding contribution in helping grow tennis at the local level. The award, created by the USTA in 1965, emphasizes the theme that

"tennis is a family game" and is given annually to a family that volunteers its time to promote amateur tennis.

Mike Huether is a USTA official and participates in USTA leagues and tournaments. He is the mayor of Sioux Falls and works with the city's park & recreation department to identify courts that

need to be refurbished, including the addition of new lights to the local McKennan Park Tennis Courts.

Cindy Huether, who also plays in USTA leagues and tournaments, is a member of the Sioux Falls Tennis Association board of directors and has been a driving force behind the building of a new indoor tennis center since becoming the association's executive director. She provides tennis equipment to local elementary schools and daycare facilities in an attempt to introduce tennis to children and teachers so that schools can develop after-school tennis programming. In addition, Cindy has organized Recreational Coach Workshops for teachers in the community, and she was instrumental in having permanent 10 and Under Tennis courts built at Spellerberg Park in Sioux Falls.

Mike and Cindy's daughter, **Kylie**, began participating in USTA tournaments and USTA Jr. Team Tennis at the age of 10. She led her high school team to the South Dakota State Championships and won state titles in doubles and singles. A varsity tennis player at the College of St. Benedict's in Minnesota, she was a four-time all-conference selection and became the youngest tennis captain in the school's history. Kylie served as the women's tennis representative on the St. Benedict's Student-Athlete Committee and has been a volunteer instructor at St. Benedict's tennis clinics. In addition, she teaches summer programming to youth for the Sioux Falls Tennis Association.

In partnership with the International Tennis Hall of Fame, the USTA presents the Bill Talbert Jr. Sportsmanship Award to junior players who exemplify the finest qualities of sportsmanship in tour-

nament play. Congratulations to **Sierra Halverson** of Burtrum, Minn., on being one of four recipients for 2012. She was honored with the rest at the International Tennis Hall of Fame in Newport, R.I., in July.

Only playing tennis the past four years, Halverson has become one of the best in the Section as she was ranked No. 1 in 16s and No. 2 in 18s. In 2010, she was the USTA Northern Section Champion in Girls 18s and was a member of the 18s National Team. She was ranked in the top 150 of the country in Girls 18s, was listed on the Prince Top 100 Players list and was a 4-star recruit by Tennisrecruiting.net.

In April of 2011, she was diagnosed with Thoracic Outlet Syndrome which is when the blood vessels or nerves in the thoracic outlet (the space between your collarbone and first rib) become compressed. She had blood clots in her shoulder and lungs and was told she would never play tennis again. After removing a rib, she has made a full recovery and is back playing tennis after a 6-month hiatus. She is playing college tennis at Southern Illinois-Edwardsville.

Seen as a rising superstar on the court, she is just as regarded for her superior sportsmanship off the court. She was named the 2010 USTA Northern Jerry Noyce Girls Sportsmanship Award winner and won the Girls Sportsmanship Award at 16 Zonals. She is extremely respectful of her opponents and tournament officials, as well as being gracious whether she wins or loses. She has earned the respect and admiration of all her tennis-playing peers.
