

Grants

Each January and May, USTA Southern Wheelchair Tennis gives to programs to fund wheelchair tennis initiatives. Here are some of our latest grant recipients.

Abilities Tennis Association of North Carolina was proud to provide wheelchair tennis lessons from tennis professional David Marquinta for 10-year-old Morgan Jenkins. Morgan has recently begun using a sports chair through ATANC, and she needed to learn how to move and play in the chair. She has made great progress in her playing ability with Coach David's help, to the delight of both Morgan and her family. Other than Morgan honing her tennis skills and making friends in the Abilities Tennis clinics, one of the memorable times for her was being highlighted in the local news.

The **Asheville Tennis Association** used their grant to extend the wheelchair indoor season for participants. Indoor court time was available into spring when outdoor weather doesn't cooperate. The players were ecstatic to be able to get out and exercise even when it's cold and wet. Players remarked that the opportunity for more tennis makes such a difference in their lives, and it also has brought in new players who wouldn't normally be as active in the cold weather months.



BlazeSports in Atlanta hosted a skills challenge and tournament for wheelchair athletes. They had 12 competitors and two coaches in wheelchairs for the event. One athlete came to the event who had never tried tennis before and was an absolute natural. They are hoping for him to become a regular in their wheelchair tennis program. They also remarked that some people came from quite a long way in Georgia and really loved the experience.

The **Greater Wilmington Tennis Association** in North Carolina used their grant to host Smash Cancer on Wheels, a wheelchair division of a larger tennis tournament called Smash Cancer May 17-19. The funds were used to offset the court costs.

Columbia Tennis Association in South Carolina had their kickoff Wheelchair Workshop, where tennis pros, volunteers and a few wheelchair players came to listen, learn and participate ahead of starting their new weekly wheelchair tennis program. Player and coach Taylor Wingate led their training workshop. They are now purchasing accessories for three tennis chairs, balls and hoppers, and they'll be developing a logo and promotional material. The grant will also be used to support the tennis professionals who will be leading the program. Check out a few pictures from the workshop. The program is set to begin in June.

Lakeshore Foundation in Birmingham, Ala., used the grant to purchase tennis equipment and competition apparel for their wheelchair tennis team members. They were also able to use the equipment during a wheelchair tennis clinic introducing new athletes to wheelchair tennis. The new athletes loved wheelchair tennis, and through interest built in that clinic, they are planning to start a youth wheelchair tennis team in June.

Collegiate

The ITA Collegiate Wheelchair Championships were held April 10-13 at the USTA National Campus in Lake Nona, Fla. A total of 33 athletes competed from University of Alabama, University of Arizona, Auburn University, Clemson University, Houston, Michigan, Michigan State, San Diego State, University of Virginia, and Virginia Tech, matching an all-time high for competing number of teams. Playing alongside the Billie Jean King Cup between the United States and Belgium brought a lot of enthusiastic fans to watch wheelchair tennis, with thousands of fans watching the championship action, marking the single-largest attended collegiate wheelchair tennis match in the event history.



In the team competition, San Diego State and Houston had an over three-hour battle for the title, with Houston coming out on top. Flight B was won by UVA's Jacob Wald, and Flight C was won by Arizona's Den Baseda in just his third ever tournament. Evan Heller from the Auburn University was named the first ever Intercollegiate Tennis Association Collegiate Wheelchair Player of the Year! The final four of the National Collegiate Singles Wheelchair Tennis Championships was played alongside the NCAA Division I singles championships in Stillwater, Okla., May 24-25. Competing athletes were Martha Harris (Alabama), Eric Court (Arizona), Gabe Puthoff (Auburn), and Nicholas Tijerina (Houston). Congratulations to Eric Court for winning the championship!
