Remembering A Corpus Christi and Texas Tennis Legend Tom Hunt, USTA Texas President

It is with a heavy heart that we inform you of the passing of John A. Zimmerman. He died on the first day of January at home with his family. John was dedicated to his family, to his church and to the game of tennis. In regards to tennis, he has a wonderful track record of accomplishments on and off the court. One of his most outstanding features is that he always had a smile on his face and a positive attitude about everything.

The following information on John was taken from the church pamphlet titled 'Celebrating The Life of John Zimmerman' which was handed out at his funeral.

John was born in Cuero on January 13, 1934. He attended Cuero High School and played football, basketball, baseball and tennis.

While in high school, he won a state singles championship and graduated as valedictorian. He went on to attend Rice University where he played both football and tennis. He was the 26th winner of the Rice University Bob Quinn Award. After graduating from Rice and before entering the United States Marine Corps, John married his high school sweetheart and the love of his life, Joyce Towery.


After his military service, John and Joyce eventually moved to Corpus Christi where they raised three daughters. John began his career employed as a CPA for various companies. In his later years he was a realtor with Caldwell Banker in Port Aransas.

John gave tirelessly of his time volunteering for the sport of tennis and his beloved church, St. John's Methodist Church. He served in many capacities, always with a smile on his face.

His main passion in life was tennis, from being an avid player to serving as a willing and enthusiastic volunteer for the CCTA and for USTA Texas. He served as a president for both organizations and remained an active member and ambassador for the sport throughout his life. It goes without saying, John was one of the greatest advocates for tennis in Corpus Christi. He was inducted to the Cuero Gobbler Hall of Fame in 2008 and the Texas Tennis Hall of Fame in 2017.

John will always be remembered as a loving husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather. Some of his most admirable qualities include his compassion for others, his patience, his love of life, his dedication to his career and his eternal optimism.

John is survived by his loving wife of 64 years, Joyce Zimmerman; their three cherished daughters, Elizabeth Kucera, (Scott), Jan Simmons (Jon), and Joy Wunderlick (Tom); eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. He is also survived by his dear sister, Charlotte Busch.

Changes to the Junior Pathway

As most of you are likely aware by now, a new competitive tournament system has been developed and will be implemented beginning January 1, 2021. While there is a lot of information to share on this topic, USTA Texas Director of Junior Tennis Julio Godreau and I wanted to provide you some quick highlights on the subject and more importantly, direct you to where you can find all necessary information going forward. Listed below are the primary questions about this new system and process.

What are the biggest changes from our current Texas system to the new competitive structure?

- The elimination of our current three tier progression (Challenger, Champs, and Super Champs) into one national seven level system.
- By a national common system, we mean that all 17 sections will use the identical format. Thus a Texas resident can compete in any state in the county.
- There will be one common point chart structure and one common national ranking for all players.

What are some of the transitional components that will take place this year?

- We have increased our tournament offerings by adding approximately 20 tournaments to our schedule.
- These new events are primarily in the Northwest and Southern regions of the state which allows for increased availability for localized play.
- For 2020, the current national and sectional ranking systems remain as they are. Additionally, the 2021 ranking system will be running simultaneously to allow players to understand, then establish their ranking for the 2021 competitive system (this ranking will be made visible in the 3rd quarter of 2021).

Where will I be able to find additional information as it becomes available?

- A specific webpage has been created that will house all relevant information on this system and the transition process. Information will be updated throughout the year at <http://usta.com/juniortour>.

The overarching purpose of this national transition to one system is three-fold. First, to provide a simplified competitive product. Second, to provide a consistent product throughout the country. And finally, it allows the USTA to create a technology platform that supports this unified system and will allow for the future growth of tennis.

Friday's portion of the event featured on-court training with top coaches from both Sections and wrapped up with an energizing, fun game with all players. Friday evening's off-site group activity provided players the opportunity to engage with new friends in a fun, social environment.

On-court training continued Saturday morning and the afternoon featured singles and mixed doubles matches followed by another action-packed, energetic large group game.



Saturday evening included a USTA Texas and USTA Southwest team dinner at a nearby restaurant to help prepare for Sunday and the continuation of the Border Battle competition.

Match introductions took place in a college-style format with the two teams lined up across from each other. Doubles matches were announced and players shook hands and exchanged personal "Section themed" gifts. Match play began

with doubles followed by singles. Both teams showed great spirit and support for their teammates, while demonstrating exemplary sportsmanship and character.

In the end, USTA Texas proved to be too powerful for USTA Southwest and was able to regain the title.

The coaches chose four players (two from USTA Southwest and two from USTA Texas) to receive Sportsmanship Awards. Dallas Ehau and Sebastian Zavala received the awards for USTA Texas.

HALL OF FAME

TEXAS TENNIS MUSEUM AND HALL OF FAME HOSTS 2019 ANNUAL BANQUET



On Saturday, November 9, the Texas Tennis Museum and Hall of Fame hosted its 2019 Annual Banquet. This year's event, entitled "WCT: A Game Changer," celebrated World Championship Tennis and its deep roots in Texas.

The cocktail reception, sponsored by Tito's Handmade Vodka, included self guided tours of the museum. Highlights included the newly renovated Collegiate Exhibit and the new inductee case.

Jim Chaffin, secretary/treasurer of the Museum, opened the program and welcomed the guests. Fernando Velasco delivered the convocation. After dinner, guests heard from Cliff Drysdale, one of the original "Handsome Eight" players of the WCT, who has devoted much of his life to promoting the advancement of tennis.

The event culminated with the induction of the 2019 Hall of Fame Class: Cliff Drysdale, Al Hill, Jr, Harry Parten and Carol Welder. During the induction, a special video of each inductee, produced by USTA Texas, was showed

and followed by an introduction of each inductee. The new members of the Hall of Fame were given the chance to say a few words and awarded a certificate, medallion and blue blazer signifying enshrinement into the Texas Tennis Hall of Fame.

Carol Welder, a native Texan, has dedicated much of her adult life to giving back to the sport of tennis. From 1986-1995, she served as the executive director of the Capital Area Tennis Association (CATA) in Austin where she developed the program and curriculum for National Junior Tennis and Learning (NJTL) and schools. She also established Good Sports, a program about character and courage and developed a six-week curriculum based on trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship.

Al Hill, Jr was an entrepreneur, philanthropist, oilman and developer but he will forever be remembered for his involvement in modernizing tennis into the professional circuit we have today. In 1968, Hill co-founded World Championship Tennis (WCT) with his uncle, Lamar Hunt, and promoter Dave Dixon. In the span of one decade, they



transformed tennis from an amateur sport into a professional powerhouse watched by millions on network television.

Harry Parten was known for his pioneering efforts in the tennis pro business, his thirty-one-year tenure as Director of Tennis at the River Oaks Country Club in Houston and his success in bringing top level professional tennis players to Texas through the River Oaks Tournament.

Cliff Drysdale is a former championship player and an outspoken and influential leader on issues on and off the court. While a top-ranked professional tennis player in the 1960s and early 1970s, he was ranked as high as No. 4 in the world, was in the top 10 six times and won 35 singles titles. Drysdale was one of the "Handsome Eight," a group of players signed by Lamar Hunt in 1968 to play in the newly formed World Championship Tennis (WCT) series.

THE LAKES

Texas Stars Shine Bright
in 2019

It's February 10, 2019. Mitchell Krueger tosses his racquet in the air and grasps his head in disbelief. He's just won his first ATP Challenger Tour title in front of his friends and family at T Bar M Racquet Club in Dallas, a place he played as a young boy. We caught up with Mitchell at T Bar M just ahead of his title defense.

"Winning my first [ATP] Challenger here in Dallas where I grew up, you couldn't really write it any better than that," Krueger says. "Especially for me being a ball kid at 10 or 11 years old; being a hitting partner as I got older and could hang with some of the guys and playing qualifying as a junior; then practicing on these courts and seeing the banners with the past champions and making it a goal to one day be on there. Today was the first time seeing the banner with my name up there -- it was pretty surreal."

It wasn't easy for Krueger, who went the distance in four of his five matches that tournament. He needed to battle back after losing the first set in the final against fellow American Mackenzie McDonald, but came through by winning a tiebreak in the second set and taking the third set 6-1. He credits the crowd for getting him over the hump in big moments like the title match.

"It's always helpful being in the U.S. and being American, but being at the club I grew up in, a lot of these people have seen me since I was a little kid

here," Krueger says. "Knowing that it doesn't matter what the score is or who I'm playing, I've always got the crowd's support on my side."

2019 was a banner year for Krueger, who not only won his first ATP Tour Event in February, but also made the main draw of the Australian Open in January. Unfortunately for him, his first round opponent ended up being the eventual champion: Novak Djokovic.

"I was a lot more nervous in the days after I qualified and leading up to the match," Krueger says. "Once I settled down and stepped onto the court, I think I handled the moment really well and soaked it in. Not many people can say they've 1) played the main draw of a Slam and 2) played on a sold out Rod Laver Court against a guy like that. The score might not have looked that close on paper, but I think I pushed him pretty well."

On paper, Krueger lost 6-3, 6-2, 6-2, but gained a wealth of experience by playing the No. 1 seed in the opening round of the Australian Open. While many are star struck to be playing one of the all-time tennis greats, Krueger kept telling himself something that's good advice for tennis players of any age or skill.

"I think the first thing for most people is getting over the fact that you're playing one of those guys," Krueger says. "He's a little younger than Fed or Rafa but I more or less grew up watching him play. It's a little surreal sometimes that these guys are still playing tournaments that you're playing. I just tried to treat it like any other match. The court's the same size...it's just another opponent playing the same sport you've played thousands of times."

One of the biggest changes for Krueger over the past two years was making the move back to Texas after spending much of his time as a pro in Florida. Krueger had worked under the tutelage of Dave Licker as a junior, but wanted to make the leap back to Dallas and work with Licker who is now at the Lakes Tennis Academy in Frisco.

“It had always been a goal of mine to come back and train here,” Krueger says. “I’ve worked with Dave since I was about nine years old and he always did a good job of seeing the bigger picture: not getting caught up on random results when you’re really young and always focused on the progress and improving my game.”

While Krueger had an incredible start to 2019, it was the heat of summer that was the high for another player at the Lakes. 17-year-old Savannah Broadus of Carrollton won the Wimbledon Girls Doubles Championship, teaming up with fellow American Abigail Forbes to take her first Grand Slam.

“I had only won one round of doubles at the French, so I didn’t have a lot of expectations [for Wimbledon],” Broadus says. “It was my first time being in London and my first time on grass so I just wanted to go out and have fun.”

After winning the first two rounds, Broadus and Forbes started to believe they could actually win it all. In the quarterfinals, they defeated the No. 2 seed in a three-set thriller, 6-7(3), 6-3, 9-7, then took just 43 minutes to win 6-1, 6-1 in the semis.

“I could not believe I was in the final of a Grand Slam,” Broadus says. “The night before, I was really excited and just wanted to get on the court. But on the day of the match, before we went on, I started to get super nervous because I didn’t want to blow it. But once we got out there, I felt good. We played girls we had already lost to and we were unseeded, so I felt like we didn’t have anything to lose.”

Broadus and Forbes had lost to their

opponent twice earlier in the year, one being in the second round at the French Open. The third time proved to be the charm, as the American duo won 7-5, 5-7, 6-2 to take the title. The two sprinted into each other’s arms and embraced in a massive bear hug.

“We were sitting there after the match waiting for the ceremony to start and we were just looking at each other like ‘oh my gosh, we just won. What the heck? How did this happen?’”

After the big win, Broadus and Forbes got a chance to attend the Wimbledon Champions Dinner alongside fellow winners like Djokovic and Simona Halep. Once home in Carrollton, the celebration was a little more modest.

“I think my brother took me out to dinner that night?” Broadus says with a laugh.

Savannah’s brother Grayson has played a big influence in her life. A star tennis player in his own right, Grayson just completed his collegiate career at Notre Dame last year.

“I always looked up to my brother,” Broadus says. “We’re super competitive, so I always want to be better than him. He set the bar high, so I always want to pass him. I also look up to Madison Keys -- I feel like we play similar. She has an amazing spirit on the court, but she’s super nice off the court. That’s what I

want to be like.”

Like Krueger, Broadus has been playing under Licker at the Lakes for years. Licker has traveled with Broadus all over the world as she’s competed in Grand Slams, recently returning from a trip to Melbourne for the Australian Open.

“He’s helped me a lot,” Broadus says. “Some of the things that he’s told me like ‘always keep fighting’ has helped me the most. You’re alone on the court, especially in singles, and you don’t have anyone to turn to. You could be out there all day, but it doesn’t end until the last point. It doesn’t matter how far you’re down, you just have to keep fighting.”

Whether it’s Broadus, Krueger or a player of any age, coaches like Licker and the rest of the staff at the Lakes have imparted many life lessons on their players. Before we wrapped up with Krueger, he shared one last motivation for any aspiring player.

“Obviously you play a tennis match to win a tennis match, but at the end of the day, winning is not the end-all be-all,” Krueger says. “Everyone has their own timeline and their own story to be written. Just keep believing in yourself, keep working hard and practicing on the things you need to work on and good things will happen.”


